SSERC Education/Industry Partnerships (EIPs) bring education and industry together in a collaborative initiative that connects employers with schools to inspire, mentor, and support the next generation of STEM professionals.


Why partner with SSERC?

Employers have a vital role to play in enhancing young people's understanding of STEM careers, developing their skills, and encouraging them to pursue rewarding career pathways. Through an EIP, you can make a tangible impact while advancing your organisation's goals for talent development, community engagement, and social responsibility.

What EIPs provide

- **Trained and supported STEM volunteers:** Employees act as role models in schools, inspiring and guiding learners through workshops, talks, and interactive activities. SSERC provides training, PVG Disclosure checks, and ongoing support to volunteers, ensuring they are confident and well-prepared to make a meaningful impact.
- **Tailored activities:** SSERC collaborates with employers to design and deliver engaging STEM-related activities that align with the curriculum and support learners in building essential skills. SSERC's expertise in teacher professional learning, combined with employer insights, helps upskill teachers to bring real-world context into the classroom.
- **Specialist support:** SSERC's established relationships with local authorities and schools help employers engage with schools that match their target demographic.
- **Support and advice on age and stage engagement.**

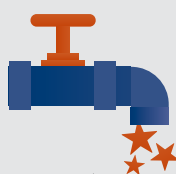
